Or facing your own fear demons

To do that, however, I want to start with a reference to a TV show that was known as "Buffy The Vampire Slayer". I think it is amazingly astute and enlightened of Joss Whedon (creator and writer of Buffy) to have written this story line. Buffy is a petite blond young woman whose life destiny is to slay all the vampires and demons that are in our world and hurting us, even though most of us don't know they exist. In this Halloween episode the "Fear Demon" is released and is causing all of the fears it encounters to actually manifest. Buffy is told it is her job to slay this demon. It is scary, but it is her destiny and her friends are in trouble, so she decides she is going to do what she needs to do. She turns to face her opponent and realizes that his actual size is about 6 inches high. She pauses for only a moment - then stomps him out with her foot!

To face what we most fear is to face ourselves; to face what we are struggling against is to realize we are struggling against ourselves. Fear would like us to believe it is huge and formidable and overwhelming, and that it has power over us. But, the truth is, we are far greater than our fears.

I have been in the alternative healing community for nearly 10 years. It was always a dream to have a holistic center, where practitioners of like mind could work together, collaborate as a team, for the benefit of all. I wanted a building that was our where we could do our work of healing, hold classes, meetings and gatherings. Each time I changed my office I improved my circumstances and got closer and closer to my dream, but I faced very real and solid feeling fears; that I was not good enough, that I didn't know what I was doing, that no one would take me seriously, that I would not be able to make enough money, that the grown-ups would make me take my toys and go home. These were my fear demons. One by one I faced them. I did not face them alone, I had friends, family, support and guidance from many sources. More importantly, I learned how to ask for help, how to open to my own power and trust it. And I learned about what my fears are telling me about me. It didn't come easy, it didn't come right away, it is still a work in progress, but it is coming. Along the way I have come to understand more about myself and what I was capable of becoming. And just how strong I am.

Fear is the lack of knowledge. Once we know what we fear, once we look at it, we can name it and we take our power back. Each time I faced my fear I faced myself. I saw myself in the mirror of my fear and once I realized that, I knew I could do what I come here to do.

In January of 2008 I decided I had to take the next step. I needed to not only leave the space I was in, but I wanted more, I wanted my center. By this time I had become very familiar with that gut fear, the one that tells me I am pushing myself out of my comfort zone. It is a good guide. I asked the Universe and all the people I knew for help, and I trusted. I had no idea how it was going to unfold; I just knew it would be ok. In April I was offered a space that would be perfect. I hesitated, at first, it was too big, and it was too much money, too much responsibility. I wanted it, I wanted to take that scary leap of faith, but it was hard.

That is when I talked to Debbie DeRusha. She had been working at Essential Kneads when I met her and I wanted to know what she had learned about being in that kind of holistic community. I told her about my dream, about RoseHeart and about the space, and we realized we wanted to make this come about together. Being open to what is right in front of you and trusting what you find can be very beneficial and at the same time frightening. But Debbie and I knew this was right for us. We trusted what we knew. I had the space and the dream, she had the experience and enthusiasm and together we had the energy and the commitment. Many other people got involved; there was an amazing outpouring of energy, support and guidance from all around us. And since our Opening Day on Sept. 13th the Universe has shown both of us time and again that this is right and it is going to go far and we are on the right path for what we want to do.

Don't get me wrong, I still struggle, I still have days when that scary fear demon is growling behind me and I am up to my neck in anxiety at the thought that I have to turn around and look him in the face. But we know each other now and it is a familiar growl, one that tells me I still have work to do. If I sit on my backside and wait for things to happen, I'll be waiting a very long time. If I am willing meet the Universe halfway, it walks with me. And that's ok with me. The Universe has the best stories to tell, and I love a good story!
